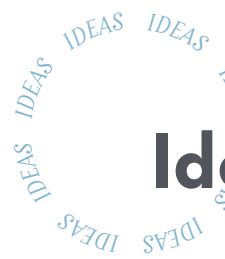

In that spirit, we were also proud to serve as the fiscal sponsor for the Coles House Foundation. This group honors the legacy of



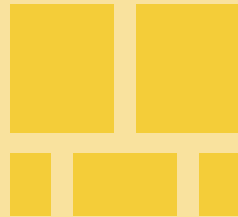
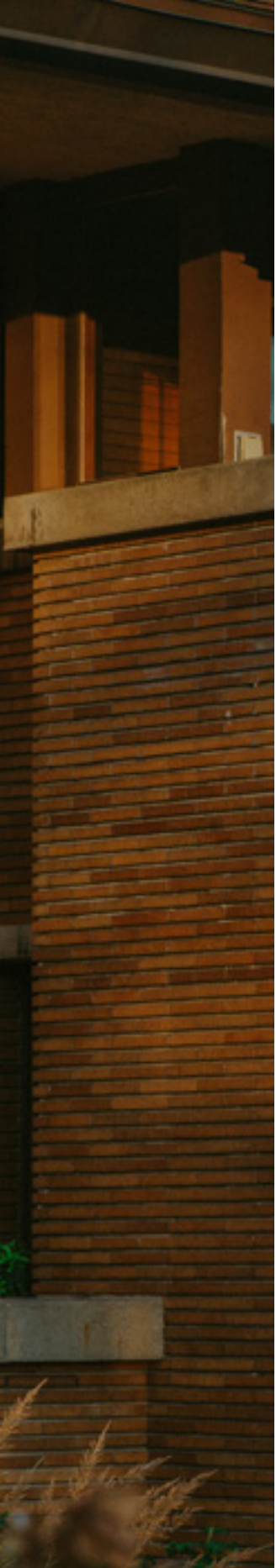

Leading the Way In Arts & Culture



As a premier cultural destination attracting visitors both near and far, the Martin House is committed to sharing our expertise with our peers in the industry.

Last year, we served as the **fiscal sponsor for the Coles House Project**, a group dedicated to preserving the legacy of prominent Buffalo-born architect Robert. T. Coles. His house and architectural design studio is in the Hamlin Park Historic District and was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2011. With this support, the group was able to lay the groundwork for impactful public programs and community engagement. The Coles House Project will join a growing community of institutions such as the Michigan Street African American Heritage Corridor, the Nash House, and the Colored Musicians Club in preserving and celebrating Buffalo's rich artistic and cultural legacy.

We also pioneered a **staff sharing initiative** with other local non-profit organizations, including the Theodore Roosevelt Inaugural Site. In this program, selected staff can contribute their expertise across multiple sites. By pooling resources and fostering collaboration, we're helping to create a more efficient model for nonprofit organizations.

These efforts demonstrate our dedication to advancing the cultural sector. We're happy to contribute where we can and to work alongside our peers in strengthening the cultural fabric of our region.



Our Dedicated Volunteer Family



The Martin House is fueled by the incredible dedication of our volunteers. Whether serving as docents, supporting the Landscape and Collections Care Committees, assisting with Special Events, or helping in the Museum Store and Office, our volunteers ensure we consistently provide exceptional experiences for every guest.

This remarkable community of over 260 passionate individuals generously contributed 15,063 hours of service throughout the year. We are deeply grateful for their generosity, commitment, and spirit!

Celebrating Years of Service

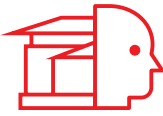
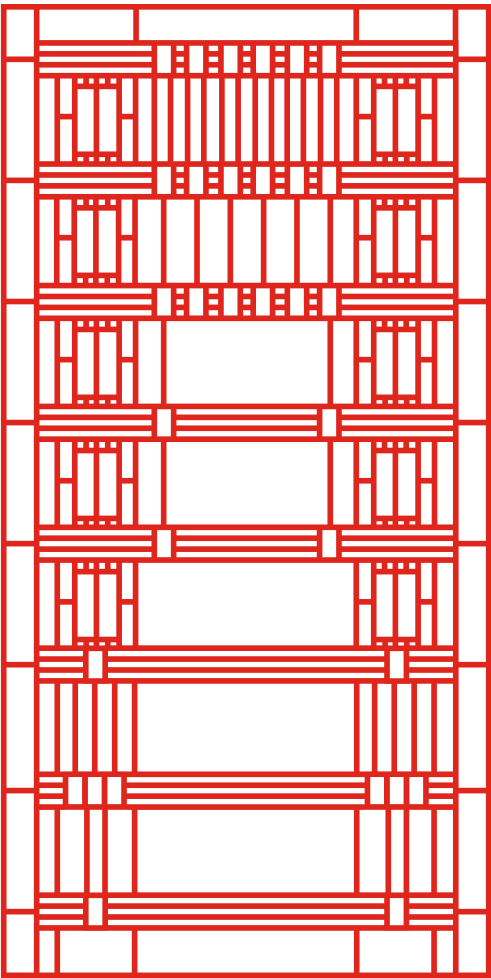
Curated with Care



To strengthen our world-class collection of artifacts related to the Martin family and their home, the Martin House continually acquires objects through purchase or by gift.

In 2024, we installed an original Wisteria art glass window in the first-floor dining room. This beautiful homecoming was made possible through a generous donation by Sushanna Stern in memory of her late husband Arthur Isaac Stern with supporting funds from Mark K. Stephens and Anthony Latess. We also acquired a Tiffany Studios floor lamp once belonging to the Martin family. The lamp holds a special place in the collection as it was donated by the estate of Foster Holcombe, great-grandson of Darwin D. Martin, through his widow Theda Hansen. The lamp will feature prominently in an upcoming exhibition, after which time it is expected to be installed in an appropriate location on the Martin House first floor.

This year, we also launched our inaugural exhibition, *Thought-Built: The Imperial Hotel at 100*, which ran from November 16, 2023 – May 12, 2024. The exhibition told the story of one of Wright’s great design achievements while situating the Martins in this important period in the architect’s career. Hundreds of visitors had the unique opportunity to experience rarely-seen architectural fragments, archival materials, rare books, and other items within the intimate setting of Barton House. This exhibition was presented by M&T Bank and Wilmington Trust.



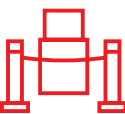
Contemporary Voices, Historic Foundations

This past year, our Creative Residency Program entered its second season with two artists developing new works of the imagination influenced by the architecture and history of the Martin House.

In July, we hosted Brooklyn-based writer and educator t'ai freedom ford. During her two-week term, ford examined the parallel narratives of the Martin House with the simultaneous construction of a Black populace and politic in Buffalo. The project resulted in the creation of a chapbook with 10 original poems that considered the dual definitions of the word “façade.” Her residency culminated with a community workshop and poetry reading.

Later, in the fall, we welcomed accomplished multi-media artist and furniture designer Cheryl R. Riley to our campus. Her residency project titled “The Wright Design” produced a series of sketches and drawings for a new suite of furniture inspired by our historic site that will develop into a proposal for a future Martin House commission. Dedicated to the education of young minds, Riley also conducted a month-long series of art-making workshops for a talented group of second grade students from Buffalo Commons Charter School.

2024 was also a robust year for our Design Aloud lecture series. In April, documentary filmmaker, curator, and writer Jesse Lerner gave a compelling presentation on Frank Lloyd Wright and the Maya of Modernism. The lecture focused attention on Mesoamerican history and imagery in the field of visual culture, including its usage in the architect’s Imperial hotel project and in his textile block houses. In conjunction with summer’s East Side Garden Walk, we partnered once again with the Nash House Museum and the Michigan Street African American Heritage Corridor to host an urban garden talk featuring author Teresa Speight, who offered her creative perspective on bold beautiful gardens for small spaces. And, in October, we were delighted to invite noted architectural historian Barry Bergdoll who offered his expertise in an informative sold-out lecture tracing Frank Lloyd Wright’s evolution as an exhibition architect. These free lectures are made possible through the generous support of the M&T Bank.



Make Yourself at Home

In 2024, we had the pleasure of welcoming over 40,600 visitors on-site — a dynamic mix of architecture enthusiasts, history buffs, curious travelers, Wright devotees, field-tripping students, gardening fans, proud Buffalonians, and many more.

That’s why we work so hard to ensure our tour offerings reflect the wide range of people who walk through our doors.

Our inaugural exhibition, *Thought-Built: The Imperial Hotel at 100*, offered an in-depth look at one of Wright’s lost works. Meanwhile, School Recess Open Houses gave guests the freedom to explore at their own pace and engage in casual conversations with our knowledgeable docents. We also expanded our popular Women of the Martin House Tour to be available year-round and continued to welcome new audiences through Free Exhibition Fourth Fridays — offering complimentary access to our rotating exhibitions.

Of course, 2024 wouldn’t be complete without mentioning an out-of-this-world celestial event: the total solar eclipse on April 8, 2024. During the days surrounding the eclipse, over 1,500 guests visited the site! The entire campus buzzed with energy as eclipse chasers traveled to Buffalo for the path of totality.

We were also honored to host groups from esteemed organizations including the Carnegie Museum of Art, the American Society of Landscape Architects, Doctors of the World, Leadership Buffalo — and we even welcomed Ambassador Dina Kavar of Jordan.

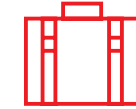

School Programs

Welcoming students to the Martin House is one of the highlights of what we do! In 2024, we welcomed more than 70 school groups. Whether it's art, math, science, history, engineering, photography (or just a love of cool architecture!), our programs are designed to spark curiosity and can be tailored to fit any grade level with fun, themed tours and hands-on activities.

Groups also included university students that enjoyed personalized tour experiences based on their unique interest areas. We met students from Toronto Metropolitan University, Finger Lakes Community College, University of Illinois, RIT, and Tecnológico de Monterrey.

In the Community

Our Education Team continued to take Martin House programs on the road. We led architecture, design, art, or history- themed activities at **North Park Community School** and also offered Architecture Club at the Academy for students that were interested in partaking in additional projects.

Persistence Preparatory, a charter school on Buffalo's East Side, is another great example of the meaningful partnerships we're building in the community. This past year, we teamed up with their fourth and sixth grade classes for a series of eight interactive sessions that explored architecture, art, and design through hands-on projects. From designing imaginative interior spaces to creating their own art glass patterns and experimenting with structural joints, the group kept very busy! As a reward for a job well done, the students celebrated with a visit to the Martin House and a printmaking activity.

Our partnership with **West Side Community Services** grew even stronger in 2024 with the launch of an exciting new teen program. Participants explored architecture, interior design, screen printing, and block printing with a variety of creative art projects. The program wrapped up with a vibrant art show in May 2025, just in time to celebrate World Art Day!

Students from **Amherst Middle School** and **Willow Ridge Elementary** took part in our **Junior Docent program**—a unique experience that brings history to life! Through the program, students dive into the story and significance of the site, then create, design, and deliver their own tours for teachers and parents. It's a fun, confidence-building exercise that gets students out of their comfort zones and into the role of storyteller and docent.

Martin House staff and volunteers also tabled events at Explore & More, Impact Expo, the Graycliff Market, and many more.

Summer Camp

July 1-5 and July 8-12, 2024

With dedicated sessions for students in grades 1-2 and 3-6, each day of camp was packed with exciting opportunities to explore the Martin House and its gardens. Campers participated in hands-on activities that introduced basic architecture and design through drawing, printmaking, building interior spaces with recycled materials, and crafting sound suits. One highlight? A fun field trip to the Buffalo Zoo just down the street! At the end of each week, we celebrated with an art show where parents could see all the amazing work their kids had created.

Architecture Adventures

Designed for kids ages 5–12, our monthly summer program offered a free and fun way for young explorers to discover the connection between architecture and nature. Each session featured hands-on activities like bug-inspired art, pressed flower creations, and projects using plants and herbs from the Martin House gardens. Every child left the Martin House with a one-of-a-kind masterpiece!

Scout Programs

Our partnership with the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts of Western New York continues to thrive! For the Boy Scouts, we offer the popular Architecture Merit Badge workshop four times a year. Scouts get the chance to meet with a real architect, explore design concepts, take part in a hands-on activity, and enjoy a tour of the Martin House.

Our programs with the Girl Scouts offer something new each time! This past year, we hosted five unique workshops, including Inspire Future Architects, Introduction to Printmaking, Garden Design, Art Glass, and Japanese Kite Making. Each session includes a tour of the Martin House followed by a creative project. Parents often join the fun too – helping out with activities and enjoying the tour right alongside the scouts.

Bricks & Brews

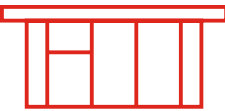
July 12, 2024

Host *an Extraordinary Event with Us*

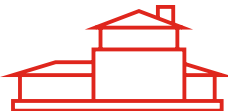

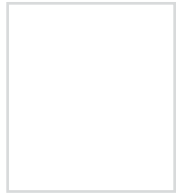

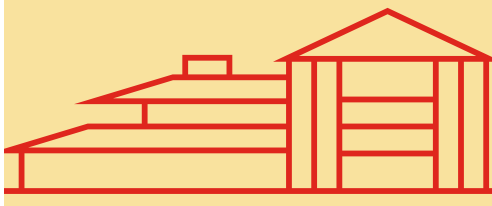
